# **My Commitment to Sustaining this Work**

**Carolyn Cicciu,** a retired teacher from Goffstown, New Hampshire, traveled on Interfaith Peace-Builders delegations in 2008 and 2012. **Carolyn began to donate monthly in February 2011, and recently raised her monthly contribution.** We asked Carolyn to share her story and why she's made a sustained commitment to IFPB:

Interfaith Peace-Builders is important to me because of its education work. The resources which IFPB shares with participants provide a background that no other travel group does. **IFPB helps us access and share the human stories that are so often lost in the media's coverage of Palestine/Israel.** I recently raised my monthly donation because I realize how deserving this organization is. Salaries for the staff are very low, but the work is so important! I hope I can up the amount next year again as I **reevaluate my resources!** 

I retired in 2008, after 36 years of teaching English to junior high aged students. I see retirement as a time to focus on issues that only received part-time attention before. Shortly after retirement, I found out about IFPB's May delegation, which I saw as a personal invitation.

My most memorable delegation experiences involve personal contact with Palestinian families who, though limited in resources, share with outrageous generosity. In 2008 and 2012, I stayed with the same family in the village of Bil'in and have developed a relationship with one of the sons. Hamde spoke during my first visit of his need to experience life free of occupation. During my second visit, he had returned to care for his parents and found his calling as a photo-journalist sharing life under

occupation with the world. We communicate via email and facebook. Hamde's passion, compassion, steadfastness, and joy are captivating. I am happy to have been able to work with him to raise money for a book, and to keep up with his efforts in unison with other young adults who are working toward peace and justice through non-violent resistance.

*I am currently working to form a New England regional group to support Palestinians.* Our local Palestine Education Network has led some good actions. Most recently, we brought Dr. Marc Ellis to the state for a couple of speaking engagements, we do presentations at retirement homes and churches using photos from our IFPB delegations, we are

planning vigils to protest Elbit Systems and a Democratic Party fundraiser, and have coordinated joint demonstrations with Open Shuhada Street in Hebron. We also write op/eds, letters to the editors, articles, and letters to our Congresswomen.

Without Interfaith Peace-Builders, I would not have been doing these actions nor would I have met so many others equally concerned about peace and justice in Palestine/Israel. That is why I am committed to this organization, and why my monthly donation is the least I can do!

## IFPB Brings the Grassroots Advocacy Training to *Expose AIPAC*

Interfaith Peace-Builders is pursuing our commitment to pair innovative delegations with pointed and effective education, advocacy and organizing work here in North America. Earlier this month, IFPB renewed our landmark Grassroots Advocacy Training program, holding our 4<sup>th</sup> event in the series.

**The Grassroots Advocacy Training was one of the highlights of this year's** *Expose AIPAC* mobilization which took place March 2 – 5 in Washington, DC. The *US Campaign to End the Israeli Occupation* again joined as a close organizing partner, and this year *CODEPINK* and the *Fellowship of Reconciliation* were also event cosponsors.

Initiated by CODEPINK, the goal of the mobilization was to protest the annual convention of the *American Israel Public Affairs Committee (AIPAC)*, held each year in DC. Hundreds of people from around the country participated in the mobilization, including 29 IFPB delegates. **Thanks to the many participants, AIPAC had a tough week in Washington.**

IFPB participated as an endorser in past events organized by *CODEPINK* – including sponsoring the "Palestine and the African American Experience" panel in 2012 – but this year we stepped up our involvement by bringing leading activists and experts to DC. Among the speakers were Phyllis Bennis, Jonathan Kuttab, Robert Naiman, Jamal Abdi, Philip Farah, Rebecca Vilkomerson, Medea Benjamin, Josh Ruebner, and Ramah Kudaimi. Panels and workshops covered a variety of topics, including the US weapons trade, the role of AIPAC in US policy, the Boycott, Divestment and Sanctions Movement, how to get active after your visit to Palestine/Israel, and more.

The weekend's events were covered in diverse media outlets. Highlights included Josh Ruebner's op/ed in *The Hill* and Rebecca Vilkomerson's piece in *The Huffington Post*. Partner organizations, the *US Campaign to End the Israeli Occupation* and *Jewish Voice for Peace*, also ran simultaneous advertising campaigns in the Washington, DC metro and on mobile trucks circling the AIPAC Convention.

**Meanwhile, we mobilized hundreds at** *AIPAC***'s doorstep.** *CODEPINK's* creative actions and props drew attention to illegal Israeli settlements, expressed solidarity with Palestinian political prisoners on hunger strike, and more.



Thanks to all those who made these events a reality!

The work continues now, as AIPAC pushes to exempt military aid to Israel from sequestration. If they get their way, needed social services such as education, healthcare, and more will be sacrificed.

### **Even More Scholarships for Youth!**

Interfaith Peace-Builders 3<sup>rd</sup> annual scholarship competition for students and young adults wrapped up in January with over 20 finalists competing for two \$1000 scholarships and a number of smaller prizes. Thanks to the success of the program, more students and young people are able to afford the cost of travel to Palestine/Israel, and benefit from IFPB's Education and Advocacy work. Already in 2013, IFPB has offered approximately **\$8000** in scholarships to **17** individuals. That adds to the more than **\$13,000** made available in 2012 through IFPB's *Scott Kennedy Memorial Scholarship Fund*.
